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Improvised Drama: Speak Out, Act Up!

For the second year in a row, KYC students took part in the annual English Drama Improvisation Competition called Speak Out, Act Up! The competition is organized by the EDB and this year students from 26 schools in the New Territories region demonstrated their skills in drama and English language. Students have to be in a team of 4-6 and they undergo training in drama improvisation prior to the Saturday competition. Four days before the event, students are given two topics

which they have to use as a base to create a five-minute performance using English. This year the performances were entertaining and impressive.

Our KYC team did exceptionally well winning two awards; a team

award for 'Best use of English' and an individual award for 'Best use of English' went to Oucia Lam. The team had two topics; 'At the Museum' and 'The phone call'. For the first topic, the group devised a performance that was set in a museum of the future and the message was a sophisticated one about the disappearance of the natural environment. With the second

topic, the team created an amusing performance about how you can get caught out if you deceive others. Both of these performances were entertaining and I am impressed with their ability to think quickly and be creative using English.






English Activity Day 2: The Mass Media

Students had the opportunity to be a DJ, or act in a role play, or play the 'Newspaper Hunter' game. The ball games proved to be popular with students identifying magazines
















Storyboard of Sleeping Beauty




King and Queen wanted to have a child very much, Soon, the Queen gave birth to a girl.




It was the custom in the land for Angels to descend from the throne and deliver God's gifts upon the newborn baby.



This eighth Angel was not dressed in garments of lights and was cloaked with a garment of darkness.




One Angel did notice the eighth Angel.



One by One the Angels presented their gifts to the baby princess,




The eight Angel took its place before the limbart princess. It stratched out its dark hands over the baby and pronounced its curse.

The princess pricked her hand on the spirdle of a spinning wheel.






Storyboard of Goldlocks and the Three Penrs




